Award	Outline of the Award
<p>EBEWE Pharma Oncology Pharmacy Grant</p> 	<p>Value of the award up to \$5,000</p> <p>This grant is designed to offer support for a wide range of research and professional development activities in <u>oncology pharmacy</u>, or <u>oncology pharmacy management</u>. Activities can include, but are not limited to: international study tours, preceptorships, international and local travel to relevant conferences and research projects specifically in relation to oncology pharmacy practice.</p> <p>Applicants must be:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. A current member of NZHPA (pharmacist, technician), with a minimum of 12 months membership; and 2. Working or teaching in the field of Oncology or managing a unit that provides oncology pharmacy service. <p>Closing date for applications – 31 August each year.</p>
<p>Baxter Development Fund</p> 	<p>Value of the award up to \$3,000</p> <p>The purpose of the award is to enable hospital pharmacists to further their knowledge in the pharmacy profession. To be eligible to apply for the award the following criteria must be met:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The applicant must be a Hospital Pharmacist who has been employed in hospital pharmacy for at least 12 months, 2. The hospital pharmacist must be employed for at least 20 hours per week 3. The application for funding must include written documentation of the use of such funds 4. The application must be for assistance to further knowledge within the pharmacy profession, which may be clinical, research or management based and may include assistance to attend conferences. It is expected that the recipient share their knowledge with their colleagues on return via internal meetings, publishing, or paper/poster presentations <p>NZHPA reserves the right to distribute the fund to one or more applicants depending on the applications in that year.</p> <p>Closing date for applications – 31st August each year.</p>
<p>sanofi aventis Pharmacy Grant</p> 	<p>Value of the award up to \$2,000</p> <p>This grant is designed to offer support for a wide range of research and professional development activities in <u>oncology and cardiovascular pharmacy</u>. Activities can include, but are not limited to: international study tours, preceptorships, international and local travel to relevant conferences and research projects specifically in relation to oncology pharmacy practice.</p> <p>Applicants must be:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. A current member of NZHPA (pharmacist, technician), with a minimum of 12 months membership; and 2. Working in the field of Oncology or Cardiovascular Disease (specifically anti-platelet or anticoagulation) or managing a unit that provides such services. <p>Closing date for applications – 31 August each year.</p>

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<p>GlaxoSmithKline Merit Award (previously called the Wellcome Award)</p> 	<p>This is an in-service award presented to a member of NZHPA who in the opinion of fellow members and on endorsement by the NZHPA executive “be a member who has provided outstanding service to the Association and New Zealand Pharmacy”. 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<p>NZ Pharmacy Education & Research Foundation Award</p> 	<p>Value of the award up to \$500</p> <p>Each year the NZ Pharmacy Education and Research Foundation selects from the papers presented at the NZHPA annual conference the “The paper most deserving of being published to a wider audience”. In addition to the financial award publication the winning paper will also be published in a New Zealand pharmacy publication.</p>																		
<p>NZHPA Education Fund</p> 	<p>Value of the award: at the discretion of the Executive. Typically values up to \$1,500 have been awarded.</p> <p>NZHPA administers a fund to assist members to attend courses, attend conferences to present papers, or to undertake special projects. Recipients of the NZHPA Education Fund award are required to present a report to the Executive that will be published in <i>New Zealand Pharmacy</i> or the <i>Pharmaceutical Journal of New Zealand (PJNZ)</i>.</p> <p>Closing date for applications – open. Applications are received throughout the year.</p>																		
<p>NZHPA Pharmacists in Mental Health SIG Study Grant</p>  	<p>Value of the award up to \$5,000 depending on the number of applications</p> <p>The aim of the grant is to encourage more pharmacists to specialize in mental health pharmacy and for Mental Health Pharmacists to continue their education in the field of mental health.</p> <p>An applicant must have been a member of the NZHPA Pharmacists in Mental Health SIG for at least twelve months before applying for the Grant and be currently working in an area of mental health (whether this be hospital or community based). The grant will be for an appropriate amount of money (depending on the purpose for which it is to be used) to partially fund mental health pharmacy postgraduate courses for SIG members. Priority will be given to applicants wishing to complete the Aston University (UK) Postgraduate Certificate or Diploma in Psychiatric Therapeutics.</p> <p>Closing date for applications - there is no official closing date for applications, as the dates for enrolment on courses vary</p> <p>For full details please see the Rules for the Grant (insert hyperlink).</p>																		

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<p>JS Peel Memorial Award</p> 	<p>Value of the award up to \$250</p> <p>Awarded to a member by the Executive at the annual NZHPA conference to the best paper from a young (graduated in the last 5 years) NZ presenter.</p>
<p>Dr L. Berry Memorial Award</p> 	<p>Value of the award up to \$500</p> <p>Awarded to a member by the Executive at the annual NZHPA conference to the best paper overall.</p>
<p>NZHPA Prize for the Best Clinical Paper/Poster (NZ Pharmacy Assistants & Technicians' Conference)</p> 	<p>Value of the award up to \$250</p> <p>Awarded to the pharmacy assistant or technician who presents the best clinical paper or poster at the annual NZ Pharmacy Assistants and Technicians Conference.</p>
<p>NZHPA Award in the Master of Pharmacy (Clinical Pharmacy) course</p> 	<p>Value of the award up to \$250</p> <p>The prize shall be awarded annually by the Council, University of Otago, on the recommendation of the Dean of the School of Pharmacy, to the student in the course for the degree of Master of Clinical Pharmacy who has the best achievement determined by consideration of results from the Advanced Clinical Pharmacy Research methods papers, and the dissertation and whose degree has been awarded with distinction. In years where no student has achieved a distinction level degree, no prize shall be given.</p>
<p>NZHPA Syd Little Memorial Prize</p> 	<p>Value of the award up to \$250</p> <p>Awarded annually to the student, School of Pharmacy, University of Otago, who has attained the highest standard of achievement in Drug Delivery Systems, and Drug Disposition and Pharmacokinetics.</p>

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<p>NZHPA Prize in Clinical Pharmacy</p> 	<p>Value of the award up to \$250</p> <p>Awarded annually to the student in the 4th year Bachelor of Pharmacy course, University of Otago, who has the best achievement in the three Quality Use of Medicines papers, PHCY 345, PHCY471 and PHCY473.</p>
<p>NZHPA Award in the Postgraduate Diploma in Pharmacy Practice</p> 	<p>Value of the award up to \$250</p> <p>The prize shall be awarded annually to the student from the School of Pharmacy, University of Auckland with the best overall performance in the Postgraduate Diploma in Pharmacy Practice course.</p>
<p>NZHPA Award for Aseptic Dispensing</p> 	<p>Value of the award up to \$200</p> <p>Awarded annually to the undergraduate from the School of Pharmacy, University of Auckland with the best overall performance in the final year Aseptic Dispensing course (the sterile dispensing component of Pharmacy 409: Professional Pharmacy Studies).</p>
<p>NZHPA Award for Integrated Pharmacy Studies</p> 	<p>Value of the award up to \$300</p> <p>Awarded annually to the undergraduate from the School of Pharmacy, University of Auckland with the best overall performance in the final year integrated pharmacy studies (Pharmacy 407 and 408).</p>
